### WHEN & WHERE:

## Dubois County June 4-6, 7 (Evening) 2024

8:30am-2:30pm daily CDT, 1:30-6:30pm Friday Evening **Dubois County Fairgrounds**, Huntingburg, Indiana

Directions: From Hwy 64 take exit 63 toward Ferdinand /Jasper. Stay on State Route 162 North for 8.3 miles, then turn left into the parking lot. From Huntingburg stay east on IN-64 and turn left onto State Route 162 North and turn left into parking lot.

## Evansville June 11-13, 2024

8:30am-3:00pm daily CDT;

June 14, 2024 (Evening) 4pm-8pm Eykamp Scout Center, Evansville, Indiana

Directions: From Lloyd Expwy east, turn right into service drive just past Vann Ave. From Lloyd west, go to Lincoln Ave and enter the State Hospital grounds. Follow the road (stay left) to stop sign and turn left.

Scout Center will be at top of hill. Park in lot at bottom of hill.

## Vincennes June 19-21, 2024

8:30am-4:00pm daily CDT

Ouabache (Wabash) Trails Park, Vincennes, Indiana

Directions: From Hwy 41, take 6th street/Vincennes Exit. Turn right onto Executive Blvd. Turn right onto N 2nd Street. Take the first left onto Old IN-67, then turn left onto Old Terre Haute Rd. Turn right onto Fort Knox Dr. Go Straight into N Lower Ft. Knox Rd. Ouabache Trails Park is at 3500 N Lower Fort Knox Rd, Vincennes, IN 47591.

### **Details:**

#### **Cost for Scouts:**

- •\$25/day (\$60.00 for all 3 days of Camp) if paid in full or postmarked by 30 days in advance.
- REGISTRATION INCREASES to \$30/day if paid or postmarked after 30 days prior to the camp start date
- •T-shirts cannot be guaranteed for registrations made after May 10. Be sure to tell your Scout leader your t-shirt size.

#### **ADULTS AND SIBLINGS:**

- There is no fee for adults/siblings wanting to attend. However, if you would like to pre-order a T-shirt, there is a \$10.00 (\$12.00 for sizes 2XL & larger) cost required.
- Parents may bring siblings if they are walking around with their Scout. However, siblings should not expect to participate in activities.

#### **COUNCIL REFUND POLICY:**

- Reservations canceled at least 30 days prior to the first day of an event will receive an 80% refund. Cancellations within 30 days, and no less than 48 hours prior, will receive a 50% refund. No refunds will be given for cancellations made the day of an event or for activities where promotion literature states "No Refunds"
- All cancellations must be made directly to the Eykamp Scout Center in writing or by calling (812) 423-5246 or toll-free (800) 264-5246 and then confirmed in writing. Refunds will be taken care of by your local District Professional.

#### WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING?:

• A sack lunch, water bottle, swimwear, towel, insect repellent, sun block, money for the trading post, sturdy shoes (no sandals or opentoed shoes), hat, hand sanitizer, and a face mask. Mark all items with your **Scout's full name AND pack number**.

#### **HOW TO SIGN UP**

• Contact your Pack leader for details on how to sign-up. While we would like all Packs to attend, individuals may attend even if their Pack does not. Individual registrations will only be accepted if your Scout's pack is not attending. In this circumstance, a parent/guardian must attend with the Scout each day. Your Scout will need to submit a completed Annual Health and Medical Record form the first day of camp. Each person (youth or adult) must complete this form.
