BALOO

BALOO is a fun, exciting and required training for all those in your Pack who are in charge of conducting a Pack family campout. It is recommended that each Pack have at least two BALOO trained adults.

What is BALOO?

BALOO stands for Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation. It's designed to introduce Cub Scout leaders to the opportunities for pack overnight camping.

This is an energetic training that will cover everything you need to know to plan and run a pack overnighter. It's more than just camping—it includes ideas for outdoor activities, games and ceremonies; information on selecting and using camping equipment; how to run a campfire program; and hands-on Cub Scout & Webelos cooking demonstrations! In short, everything you need to know to make your pack overnighter a fun, successful event!

Why do I need BALOO?

BSA has made several changes to the camping policy for Tigers, Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts. Besides participating in council camps (day camp, resident camp), packs may now organize overnight campouts for boys and their families. Adults leading a pack overnighter must attend BALOO training.





Fellow leaders of Buffalo Trace Council,

We could tell a long story about YPT needing renewed every two years, or about the issues it can cause with recharters when your unit logs in.

Long story short, if your YPT is close to needing renewed, do not wait, please take the time to renew it now and avoid the problems and hassle.

Youth protection training is the most important training we all need, to protect the youth we all serve. It remains the policies we must follow to hold ourselves and others accountable for the safety of the youth and volunteers in our programs.

Easiest option to update your YPT is to take the online course at myscouting.org, on your own Scout account, and print your certificate.

There will also be a few opportunities to attend a live training such as the University of Scouting on November 19, 2022.

So, make your charter quicker and easier by updating your YPT earlier, rather than later. Keep yourself from missing events because your YPT is out of date.

Do you know a Scouter who needs to be recognized for their dedication, passion, and hard work?

Nominate them for the District Award of Merit. The District Award of Merit is the highest honor a district can bestow upon a volunteer, The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding natureat the district level. It is presented annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 units in the district. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside of Scouting, or both. The nature of noteworthy service may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.
