Adam advanced through the ranks and earned his Eagle Scout Rank in 2008. Immediately after turning 18, he became an Assistant Scoutmaster concentrating on helping Scouts attain rank First Class after they joined the troop.

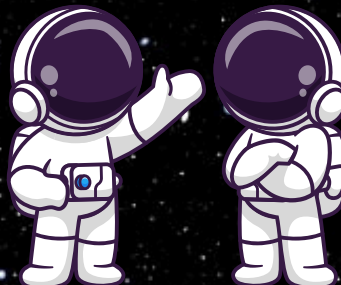
After a few years, Adam wanted to expand his scouting journey and work in different areas of the program. Reflecting on how much fun he had participating in the Cavalcade program at Philmont Scout Ranch and with the encouragement of Derek Lake, he applied for a commissary position in 2010.

The next four years Adam worked two 6-months and two 3-months stints at the Philmont Scout Ranch and at the Philmont Training Center during the fall of 2010 and 2013. He started out as an Assistant Commissary Clerk at Ponil Camp, eventually becoming the Head Cook, Assistant Camp Director and finally Camp Director at Zastrow in 2013.

Adam transitioned from serving at the troop level, to working with the Native Trails District and Council taking on the role of Unit Commissioner and sitting in on District Committee Meetings. He progressed to Day Camp Program Director for two years and the Native Trails Training Chairman. His current role is Program Chair for the Native Trails District.

Adam is a brotherhood member of the Kiondaga Lodge, Wood Badge graduate and was awarded the District Award of Merit and Silver Beaver Award for his service to the Buffalo Trace Council.

Adam has stayed involved in scouting because he loves the program for the values, opportunities and mission it provides to our youth members. He strives to provide a safe and fun program to help Scouts make lifelong friendships and to help them advance in the scouting program.

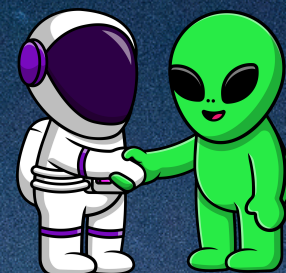

Buffalo Trace Council Membership Renewal

All registrations are for 12 months. Your renewed membership will start on the day after your current expiration date.

An email notification and renewal link will be sent 60 days before your membership expires to you and your unit leadership. You will also get a notification when you log in to my.scouting.



Family/Self Pay

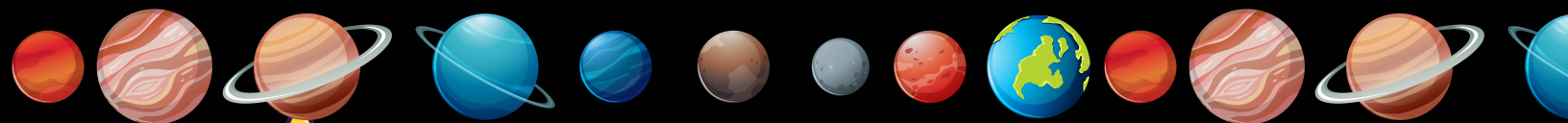
- The link in the renewal email will direct you to a renewal form on my.scouting.
- If you are registered in multiple positions, select the position you want to be listed as your primary position.
- You will then pay your membership fees with a credit card and submit your membership renewal.
- The unit will have to approve your submission.

A Key 3 member will need to go into Organization Manager to the roster and select Membership Renewal Orders to approve renewals that have been processed through family/self pay.

Unit Pay

IF THE UNIT IS PLANNING ON PAYING THEIR MEMBER 'S RENEWAL FEES, they have to go to Organization Manager on my.scouting and select the Unit Pay option.

- Once that option is selected...
 - the Key 3 will be notified each month about who is due to renew.
 - they can then go to the roster and select which members they are renewing.
 - after selecting who they want to renew, they can pay with credit card or establish an ACH and submit the renewal.

District Award of Merit



Do you know a Scouter who needs to be recognized for their dedication, passion, and hard work? Nominate them for the District Award of Merit. The District Award of Merit is the highest honor a district can bestow upon a volunteer. The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level. It is presented annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 units in the district. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside of Scouting or both. The nature of noteworthy service may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or to a small group of youth over an extended period of time.



Silver Beaver Award

The Silver Beaver Award is a council-level distinguished service award. Recipients of this award are registered Scouters who have made an impact on the lives of youth through service given at the council level. This is the highest award a council can bestow upon a volunteer. This award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters.
